Alongside our Good Ofsted report, we achieve exceptional outcomes for our students.

We have been the highest performing non-selective school in Stoke-on-Trent in two of the last three years. In 2023, our Year 11 students achieved the highest number of Grade 9s in the Academy's history.

# **Academy Life**

### **Electives**

### We are proud to offer an exciting variety of electives, helping our pupils to uncover their passions, expand their horizons and become well-rounded individuals.

Whether learning an instrument, taking part in a school performance, representing the school at sport, or something else entirely, we are confident every pupil will find an elective they love at our school.

Our electives programme enables our students to develop and deepen existing interests, or stoke their passion for something new. Each of our clubs supports the development of our key Co-op values.

With around fifty different electives available, there is plenty to choose from, and certainly something for everyone's interests. All students in KS3 participate in at least one activity each term.



Students from all year groups also have the choice of participating in a range of additional, optional activities throughout the school week.

### **Educational Visits**

All students take part in three visits each year. Recent visits include Barcelona, Jamie's Farm, Oxford University, Manchester Museum and Aintree Racecourse.

### **Student Leadership**

There are a range of ways in which students at the Academy can contribute to our community.

This is so that all students are able to participate fully as active citizens, take ownership over their education and experience at the Academy. Leadership roles include CYLs (Co-op Young Leaders), Student Council, Peer Mentors, Subject Mentors, Diversity Champions and many more.

### **Our Pastoral Care**

All students have a Form Tutor, Year Manager and Head of Year who see them daily. In additional we have a dedicated pastoral hub; the iZone. Guidance received from the iZone ranges from mentoring, counselling, health, language support, academic catch-up interventions and behaviour support.

### **Facilities**

We have first class facilities, including fully floodlit Astro Pitches, ICT suites and music practice rooms. We are currently undergoing a £7m expansion of the building to create a state-of-the-art learning environment.
